## Fall '07 MU Survey

In December of 2007, Karl Franke and other Marywood student surveyors randomly approached almost 200 students with a very brief nine question survey to fill out secretly and "on the spot." Here are the results (the website marywoodfreespeech has full details):

**60%** of students say that they have been in a course where they think they have to agree with the professor to get a good grade.

**45%** have felt inhibited about expressing their ideas

**75%** want an independent newspaper or newsletter

**84%** did not know they gave up free speech rights by enrolling

**45%** said they would hand out flyers like this to prospective students

43% said they would consider transferring if Marywood punishes students for speech

**59%** did not like dorm rules restricting speech

**59%** think the dorm visitation rules are too restrictive

Analysis Point: The survey does NOT get at what percent of the Marywood professors cause some students to feel inhibited. Individual professors are not rated yet. In the works?
